In regard to my education history, I have passed my School Leaving Certificate (SLC) with distinction score (73.25%) from Chamunda Ma Vi Jorpati Kathmandu Nepal. Till that, I was focusing on my goal to spread happy and smile on every people and become a nurse Then, I joined Nepal Institute of Health Sciences, Boudha Kathmandu Nepal and successfully completed my PCL Nursing examination in 2014 with 76.84% in aggregate. Furthermore, I have secured overall score of 5.5 in IELTS examination conducted by IDP which was positive point to fulfill my dream. My sole objective is to pursue my education and career in nursing and undertake Certificate IV in Ageing Support and Diploma of Nursing courses at Australian Health and Management Institute (AHMI), Canberra, Australia.

My earliest memory of being in a hospital is when I was 10 years old; my grandmother had suffered a heart attack and was rushed to a hospital. She was admitted there for a week and was told dead later on. Also I worked at Nursing care Home Pvt.Ltd as a staff Nurse from 27th October 2015 to 1st June 2016 as a full time employee, from 5th September 2016 to 16th November 2017 as a staff Nurse at Dental College Teaching Hospital & Research Centre. Side by side, I was focus-ing about my abroad study so; I manage my time and joined IELTS class. More-over, I experienced and learned many things from this 3 years period about this field and a carrier from this field and I am confident that this gap will not make any problem in my path however; the knowledge that I gained will flourish being my strength. I have enjoyed every minutes of my work. Finally, I gave my IELTS exam and come to know about Australian Health and Management Institute (AHMI) through my consular.

Furthermore, My Father Juddha Bahadur Juwarat very humble and supportive with my every purpose. He always supported me on my work, study and moti-vates me to do more. When I complete my work period on 16th November 2017, I wait for the intake in Australian Health and Management Institute (AHMI) then start processing for Australia. Then I focus on making required documents for Australia.

In my point of view, Australia has been the first choice of thousands of Nepa-lese for their higher education. It has been the favourite educational destination to many Nepalese stu-dents since many years as it offers wide range of courses by experienced Australian teachers. Concluding to start with Diploma level from Registered Training Organization (RTO), I have gone through different websites researched about the colleges like Ransford College, Australian Harbour International College (AHIC), Queensford, and IHNA. I studied about TAFE, NSW but did refuse to go in knowing its stringent entry criteria. I researched another Nursing college from Sydney and found Ransford College which cost AUD 30,000 with a course of 84 weeks which is generally expensive for international students to afford and the course duration was less so I quit it. Similarly I have also research some university of Canberra such as Australian Catholic University limited, University of Canberra and Canberra Institute of Technology. The college has excellent retention rate with very affordable fee structure. It offer ample flexibility that we can attend classroom courses or study online which all factors are very keen need for over further carrier.

Australian Health Management Institute (AHMI) aims at all times to a positive and rewarding learning experience for all students. As a registered training organization AHMI is bound to comply with the Vocation Quality Framework, the national Code of practice and other requirements specified by the Australian Skills Quality (ASQA). Furthermore, AHMI has affordable college fee which one of all the considerable factor coming for a developed country. In addition, its class time-table is flexible for me to adjust to a new schedule.
